

Outer Banks Area Wide Net Script

At 7:55 PM- This is (your call sign). The Outer Banks Area Wide Net will begin at 8:00 PM. This is (your call) monitoring.

At 8:00 PM- Calling all stations, this is the Outer Banks Area Wide Net.

Good Evening. This is (your callsign , phonetically), my name is (your name) and I will be your net control this evening. I am located in (your location) and I am using the (frequency) repeater in (repeater location).

This net is conducted weekly on Thursday evenings at 8:00 PM. Check-ins can be made using the 145.150 repeater in Buxton, the 145.290 repeater in Nags Head, the 145.110 repeater in Kill Devil Hills, the 146.940 repeater in Currituck, the 442.725 repeater in Columbia as well as checking in through K4OBX-L on Echolink.

The purpose of this net is to promote fellowship among the Amateur Radio Operators of the Outer Banks and surrounding areas and to help us to develop our communications skills. It also provides us with an opportunity to test our equipment that may be used during an emergency or a scheduled public service event. Check-ins from all licensed Amateurs are welcomed and encouraged.

Is there any emergency or priority traffic for the net? If so, please call Net Control, (your call sign). (**Acknowledge or hearing none, continue**).

Are there any announcements for the net? If so, please call Net Control (your call sign). (**Acknowledge or hearing none, continue**).

I will call for mobile check-ins, check-ins by geographical areas and for check-ins using Echolink. Please speak slowly and respond with your amateur call sign, phonetically, and your name. Let me know if you are “staying” for informal comments or are checking “in and out”. After taking all check-ins, I will go back through the list and call upon those staying in the net for their informal comments. After keying your microphone, please pause briefly before speaking to allow for the delay with the linked repeaters. Please correct me for any mistakes that I might make.

Begin to ask for check-ins. Please acknowledge them by repeating their call sign, name and whether they are “staying” or checking “in and out”.

Are there any mobile stations that would like to check in? Please call Net Control, (your call sign).

Are there any check-ins from **Hatteras, Frisco** and **Areas farther South**? Please call (your call sign).

Any check-ins from **Buxton** or **Avon**? Please call (your call sign).

Any check-ins from **Salvo, Waves** or **Rodanthe**? Please call (your call sign).

Are there any check-ins using **Echolink**? Please call (your call sign).

Any check-ins from **Roanoke Island** and **Wanchese**? Please call (your call sign).

Any check-ins from **Nags Head**? Please call (your call sign).

Any check-ins from **Kill Devil Hills** or **Colington**? Please call (your call sign).

Any check-ins from **Kitty Hawk**? Please call (your call sign).

Any check-ins from **Southern Shores, Duck** or **Carolla**? Please call (your call sign)

Any check-ins from **Manns Harbor** and the **Mainland**? Please call (your call sign)

Are there any check-ins from **Anywhere**? Please call (your call sign)

This concludes the formal portion of the net. I will now call upon the check-ins who have stayed in the net for their informal comments.

Go back through the list of check-ins, asking for their comments

After all Amateurs have made their comments

Are there any late check-ins or additional comments for the net tonight? Please call (your call sign).

Thank you to everyone for checking in this evening and I hope that you will join us again next week.
